BIPOC-owned and underserved operations throughout the region. Thank you to all the donors, investors, and grantors who have made this growth possible!

It is a potent time to be doing the work we do. With the sobering assault on the people of Ukraine and the global uproar that has emerged in response, we find ourselves seeing the value of our work through yet another lens. Building robust, regenerative local food systems is ever more important as community resilience and imminent supply chain issues are top of mind.

In that vein, FoodCap is part of a collaborative effort with <u>Slow Money NC</u>, <u>Croatan Institute</u>, and <u>Rural Beacon Initiative</u> to support the acquisition of 50 acres in a historically Black community in eastern North Carolina, Vera Brown Farm. This acquisition will allow for the creation of an educational sustainability hub, a model of resilient rural development that is scalable, replicable, and addresses the urgent climate and social issues of our time. 
