# 🔶 CAPITAL IN THE FIELD 🛛 🗲



## Dodo Farms // Howard County, Maryland

<u>Dodo Farms</u> is a Maryland-based, immigrant-owned, and Certified Naturally Grown farm producing diversified veggies and herbs for loyal customers in DC and Maryland. In

March, FoodCap proudly supported them with a second round of 0% interest financing as they transition to their brand new, forever(!) farmland.

Co-owned by Temitope (Tope) Fajingbesi and Niyi Balogun, **the farm is committed to practices that build soil health**, encouraging biologically diverse soil ecosystems through use of compost, cover cropping and green manure, and seasonal crop rotation.

**Foodshed Capital worked closely with Dodo and colleagues at** <u>Dirt Capital Partners</u> over the course of 2023 to be a resource as they sought out the perfect piece of land in a region where land prices make it nearly impossible for small-scale farmers to purchase land.

Our first 0% interest loan to Dodo in 2022 allowed them to purchase an on-farm vehicle to lighten the load of harvest and daily farm chores on the leased land where Dodo Farms was born. Now, with **the unmatched security and autonomy that comes with land ownership**, Dodo is wasting no time putting this second round of 0% financing from FoodCap to work as they build deer fencing, install drip irrigation, and get seedlings in the ground for the 2024 growing season.



### Happily Natural Day // Richmond, Virginia

Happily Natural Day (HND) was founded in Richmond, Virginia in 2003 as an annual African centered festival dedicated to holistic health wellness and social change. In 2008, the

organization began working with Black farmers to address the issue of food insecurity in formerly redlined neighborhoods. That work expanded in 2012, when Happily Natural began transforming vacant lots into urban gardens and green spaces.

**Executive Director Duron Chavis is an urban farmer, holistic health and wellness advocate, vocal change-maker, and all around mover-n-shaker** who is dedicated to reparative justice and building thriving BIPOC food systems.

With a focus on building power for Black and brown communities, the organization is quite literally **cultivating a new generation of BIPOC farmers through its** <u>Central Virginia</u> <u>Urban Farming Fellowship</u>, and increasing local food access through the multiple urban farms it helps manage.

A **0% interest bridge loan will help HND front the costs of an NRCS high tunnel** to extend the growing season at Sankofa Community Orchard, a five-acre green space dedicated to food justice and climate resiliency that is home to 80 fruit trees in Richmond's Southside.
